Watch "Overnight". Compare Troy Duffy's experience making "Boondock Saints" to Herzog's experience making "Fitzcarraldo." Contrast these two filmmakers.

There are huge differences between Troy Duffy's "Bandock Saints" and Herzog's "Fitzcarraldo, I will discuss each separately:

In Herzog's "Fitzcarraldo" the genre is adventure drama, this movie was not shot traditionally like the Hollywood movies, as usually known from Mr. Herzog he likes to do things his way even in his precious productions he always has this different creative vision,

Instead of using special effects and similar techniques Herzog insisted in shooting the movie in the Amazon River and Jungles using real nature shots and native amazon Indians that added more depth and credibility to the story and the movie. The movie might be imperfect in some scenes but the efforts put into this huge production must be appreciated.

Speaking of production and beside being a huge one, the people who worked behind and in front of the camera, the distances travelled the effort made are priceless (I

read that the shooting took 4 whole years and I also read about a lot of obstacles and challenges that the crew faced during shooting this movie).

As mentioned before such efforts, vision and production must be respected and highly appreciated.

As for Troy Duffy's "Bandock Saints" I would classify it under thriller, action movies,, I respect that Mr. Duffy wrote and directed this movie himself he has a great vision more modern than Herzog, he used special effects and sound effects (which Herzog never used in "Fitzcarraldo").

The story telling techniques, the shooting techniques even the editing, almost everything is different between both movies that shows two different visions of two outstanding creative forces.
