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2. How did sound synchronization affect the film industry?

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



As an example, the movie "The Moon is Blue" marked the first time a movie was released to theatres without the traditional stamp i movie came out in 1953.












The French had developed a French impressionist cinema, also referred to as the **first avant-garde** or **narrative avar** German, and Russian films and filmmakers of the 1920s.











The style relied on optical effects as well as rhythmic editing to set in apart.
